The Church in Abingdon is a voluntary organization, whose running costs are met by the subscriptions of the member churches. It has charitable status under the Church in Abingdon Development Trust Limited.

Nature and Purpose

The forerunner to the Church in Abingdon (CiA) was The Abingdon & District Council of Churches. The CiA was formed in 1988 when the Ministers and Congregations of eight churches signed The Local Covenant, in which they agreed:

- to work together to proclaim the Gospel and encourage neighbourly care;
- to pray for unity and yet to value the spiritual traditions of all the churches;
- to share the ordained ministry and Holy Communion according to the disciplines of each denomination.

Subsequent to the original Covenant, five further churches have become part of the CiA.

Mission Statement

The mission statement of the CiA was developed in February 1992 and is:

- to bring a fresh global vision of hope through God's love to the people of Abingdon, offering them good news of forgiveness, reconciliation and new life through Jesus Christ;
- to rediscover, live out and present the Gospel through our fellowship and worship, unity and diversity;
- to express this message through relevant words and actions in the community and by cooperating with others to identify and meet specific needs so that lives are changed, the Church grows and our local community increasingly reflects the values of the Kingdom of God.

Governance

The governing structure of the CiA has been in place since July 2007, and is as follows:

The **Governing Body** comprises all staff members and a lay representative from each church, the CiA Administrator and Finance Committee. Representatives from any CiA Task Groups can also attend. It meets 5 times each year and is the main decision-making and action body of the CiA. It accepts and approves the financial accounts of the CiA and will review and give oversight to Community Projects and Task Groups. At the AGM the Governing Body will approve the previous year's finances and where necessary appoint members of the Leadership Team and Finance Committee. Anyone may attend the AGM, which is the first meeting of each year.

The **Leadership Team** comprises of four members elected from the Governing Body, two staff and two lay, including the Chairperson; the Administrator; and the CiA Treasurer/member of the Finance Committee. It meets 3-6 times each year and

provides day-to-day management of the CiA by making essential decisions in between meetings of the Governing Body, enabling the Governing Body to function effectively in its strategic and decision-making role; and liaising with the Finance Committee and the Task Groups. It will think and pray about the advancement and strategy for the ongoing mission of the CiA and provide ongoing oversight for the Administrator.

The **Staff Group** comprises all the employed and voluntary leaders in the CiA member churches. It meets regularly to pray for the town, CiA member churches and the mission of the CiA; to offer mutual support through prayer and deepening relationships; to engage in Bible study and theological discussion; to feed ideas, suggestions and concerns to the Leadership Team.

The **Annual Celebration** occurs once a year to showcase the work of the CiA, offering an opportunity to give thanks and to be envisioned for the year ahead. The Celebration will include an act of worship, a talk given by a visiting speaker, prayers for the future of the CiA and its projects, a light supper and an exhibition of CiA Task Groups.

FUNDING PROCEDURES FOR THE CHURCH IN ABINGDON

The Church in Abingdon (CiA) has two funds, namely the General Fund and the Community Projects Fund.

General Fund

The general fund budget for the next financial year, running from 1st January to 31st December, will be brought to the previous year's November meeting of the Governing Body for approval. Once approved, the subscriptions will be payable from 1st January of the financial year in question, when requested by the Treasurer, and apportioned amongst the member churches on the basis of membership as notified by each member church. Some initiatives, like Christian Listeners and Town Centre Chaplaincy, are considered 'core' and will be funded out of the General Fund.

Community Projects Fund

Community projects fall into two categories, namely long term and annual.

- I. Long-term community projects are ones where the Governing Body has agreed to a three-year financial commitment, and to the level of that commitment each year. This level of commitment could remain the same (as it usually does), increase or even decrease each year.
- II. Annual community projects are ones where the Governing Body has agreed to fund for one year only.

Process for Funding and Decision-making

1. All applications, whether long term or annual, should be submitted to the Administrator in the first place. Each application needs to be supported with a costed plan. Long-term projects need a three-year projection of costs.
2. Each application will then be taken to the Leadership Team, who will either agree or disagree with it in principle. They may call for further information from the applicant before coming to their decision.
3. Once agreed by the Leadership Team, all long-term projects will then be referred to the Finance Committee for comment, before going to the Governing Body for approval.
4. With annual projects, the Leadership Team will have the authority to agree up to £250 in total each year without reference to the Finance Committee. They will report their decision to the Treasurer and to the next meeting of the Governing Body.
5. The path of annual project applications exceeding £250 is similar to that for long-term projects, and liaison between the Finance Committee and the Administrator will be necessary prior to submission to the Governing Body.
6. Should there be insufficient funds available to meet a recommendation, then the Governing Body will need to decide either to defer any grant to the following year or seek additional funding straightaway. If the latter, then monies will be requested from all member churches as a second call apportioned on the same basis as indicated above.
